Our Story

Street Kicks was founded by two medical students who witnessed a patient, who was experiencing homelessness, walk out of the hospital with only yellow hospital socks to cover his feet. We were determined to find a way for all patients to be discharged with adequate footwear and began collecting shoe donations the following week. Street Kicks has developed into a sustainable resource providing patients in need with socks and shoes upon discharge from Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, Michigan.


